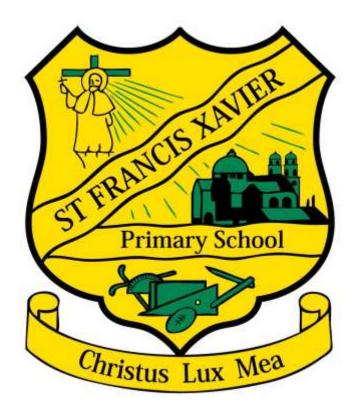

### **School Improvement**

Success Measures of 2016

St Francis Xavier Annual School Improvement Plan (ASIP) for 2016 included the following focus point. The success measures have been included; however several are still yet to be embedded in the school environment and require ongoing development.

## Message from Key Groups 2016 Principal Report

This year, St Francis Xavier's faced change in several aspects. A new Assistant Principal, new Principal, and new direction within the region and system of Catholic Education with the Collaborative project being a substantial commitment by the school.
